Unfortunately, this has been an ongoing issue since the construction of the facility and has now become a safety concern to users of this facility. An interim solution has been installed to address the immediate safety concerns and City staff are investigating permanent solutions through engaging flooring experts and structural engineers.  City staff have engaged a structural engineer to assess the floor and take core samples during the week of 7 October 2024. The report is expected within 1 week, after which a builder's quote will be sought. A preliminary inspection has been conducted and it shows that no moisture membrane was installed.
