PURPOSE

1. To review Council's delegations to the Chief Executive Officer and other employees.

BACKGROUND

- 2. In order to carry out its functions efficiently and effectively, Council has the ability to delegate its powers and duties to the Chief Executive Officer (or to another staff member, in some cases).
- 3. Section 5.46 of the Local Government Act 1995 requires each Council to review its delegations at least once every financial year.
- 4. Council last reviewed its delegations on 21 June 2010. The current delegations must therefore be reviewed by 30 June 2011.

DETAILS

- 5. The current delegations of Council, adopted in June 2010, plus a number of subsequent delegations, are shown in Attachment 1.

- Recommend refusal of subdivision applications that are not specific with Local Planning Scheme No 3, Council policy, the Residential Design Cod 6, an approved Outline Development Plan or Structure Plan, guided development scheme or about the plan as applicable.
- c) Variation to the minimum lot sizes for restrictial subdivisions can be supported in accordance with the Western Australian Planning Commission Reity DC 2 (Residential Subdivision).

9. Appeals (Review)

To respond to appeals to defend the decision of Council or a delegated decision. If the appeal involves mediation, and as part of that mediation variation to any standard provision contained in any policy or the Scheme is sought, then the matter shall as a swarded to Council for consideration as to whether to support that variation.

To determine appropriate conditions to be recommended to be applied to applications the subject of a successful appear to the state Administrative Tribunal (SAT), and enter into Minute of Consent Orders accordingly.

These delegations may only be exercised subject to compliance with the relevant legislation, and in accordance with Council policy.
